Re: Response to the Hawaii Government Employees Association Demand to Bargain Letter Dated September 20, 2022

Dear Ms. Bulosan:

Thank you for your letter dated September 20, 2022, regarding a Demand to Bargain for Bargaining Unit 6 (BU06). While the Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) recognizes the urgency of the issues outlined in your correspondence, it does not believe that bargaining is warranted at this time.

The issues raised in your correspondence are cost items and will also require the State's Chief Negotiator in the Office of Collective Bargaining and the Department of Budget and Finance to agree to commence bargaining. The Department has been informed that the current Administration will not be entering into any mid-term bargaining.

Additionally, the newly ratified BU06 contract between the Hawaii State Board of Education and the Hawaii Government Employees Association (HGEA) does not have a mid-term bargaining provision for cost items and therefore, is not warranted.

Thank you for the HGEA's continuing commitment to Hawaii's Public School system.
